The Indiana Chapter of the Delta Upsilon Fraternity, located at Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, was chartered on December 11, 1915, as the eleventh national social fraternity on the Indiana University campus. The forerunner organization was a debating society called the wranglers after a similar debating society famous at Oxford and Cambridge Universities. Today the fraternity is located at 1200 East Third Street in Bloomington, Indiana, and has as its main purposes the promotion of friendship, the development of character, the diffusion of liberal culture, and the advancement of justice.

In order to eternally honor John, several of his fraternal brothers initiated a campaign to create this scholarship in his name. The initial goal of \$10,000 was achieved, permitting a \$1,500 annual scholarship to be given to an undergraduate chapter member who possesses and displays the qualities that John exemplified and brought to Delta Upsilon.

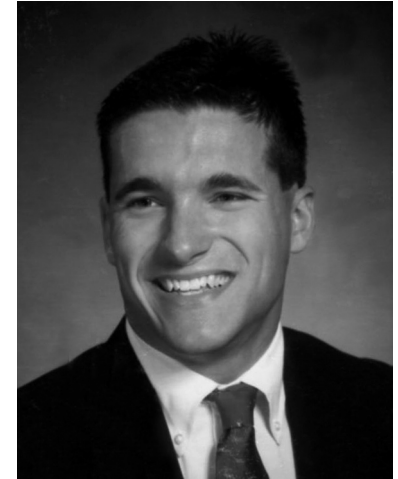

The John R. Quatroche, Jr., Scholarship

Purpose:

The John R. Quatroche, Jr., Scholarship is intended to reward an active member of the Indiana Chapter of the Delta Upsilon Fraternity who most demonstrates the qualities of the late John R. Quatroche, Jr. This scholarship award may be used in any manner to offset the costs of obtaining an education at Indiana University, Bloomington.

Selection:

Near the end of fall semester or beginning of spring semester, the active members of the chapter will nominate five eligible candidates for the scholarship. Each nominee will submit an application (to be provided by the selection committee) detailing:

- declared major
- cumulative grade point average
- extra-curricular activities

All applications will be reviewed by members of the selection committee and a final decision regarding the recipient of the scholarship shall be made by this committee.

Qualifications:

To be eligible for the John R. Quatroche, Jr., Scholarship, an active member must meet the following requirements:

- The nominee shall be in good standing within the Delta Upsilon Fraternity with no outstanding house bills, fines, or fees.
- The nominee shall have a declared major at the Bloomington campus.
- The nominee shall be in good standing with Indiana University, with no outstanding tuition bills, fines, or fees, and not be on academic probation.

- The nominee must clearly demonstrate exceptional leadership within the Indiana Chapter of Delta Upsilon and must clearly demonstrate that he has gained the respect of the active members of the chapter by leading by example; the nominee must demonstrate the utmost integrity in all endeavors.
- The nominee must demonstrate above-average academic achievement.
- The nominee must participate in extracurricular activities on behalf of the chapter, which may include ROTC, IU Sing, Intramurals, and Little 500.

Amount:

The recipient of the John R. Quatroche, Jr., Scholarship shall receive a one-time \$1,500 award.

Notification:

Each year the selection committee shall inform the chapter's scholarship chairman or president of its decision. The scholarship will be awarded at the Delta Upsilon fall or spring initiation ceremony.

John R. Quatroche, Jr.

John R. Quatroche, Jr., Chief Warrant Officer II-Aviator, U.S. Army, was born on December 27, 1965, in Dunkirk, New York, and grew up in suburban Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. After graduating from Plum Senior High School in 1984, where he lettered in swimming and track, John entered Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, where he joined the Indiana Chapter of Delta Upsilon Fraternity.

During his years at the Indiana Chapter, John played a strong role in helping develop new members. He was a hard worker who enjoyed the friendship and brotherhood of the fraternity.

“Quatro,” as he was known to his friends, always had the dream of flight. After graduating from Indiana in 1988, John entered the U.S. Army and was stationed at the U.S. Army Aviation Center at Fort Rucker, Alabama. In 1989, John achieved his goal by earning his wings as a combat Cobra helicopter pilot. The helicopter was his passion, and you could hear the excitement in his voice each time he talked about flying the Cobra. During his years as an aviator, John served in the Seventh Light Infantry Division at Fort Ord, California. His final assignment was Camp Eagle, South Korea, and he earned the rank of Chief Warrant Officer II-Aviator in July 1991.

After a long, hard-fought battle against a cancer known as immunoblastic lymphoma, John passed away on July 4, 1992. In his short life he accomplished many of his goals and touched many lives. John is survived by his parents, Dr. J. Robert Quatroche, Vice President for University Advancement (retired) and Dr. Diana J. Quatroche, Professor and Chairperson, Elementary, Early, and Special Education, respectively, at Indiana State University, Terre Haute, Indiana. His brother Michael, honorary DU member, is deceased.

Quatro was a good friend. His contagious smile and indomitable fighting spirit during his illness underscored the character, tenacity, and optimism he displayed and will forever be etched in the memories of his fraternal brothers, friends, and family.
