



**Randy**, who majored in Finance, joined D.U. as a freshman in 1961. Right from the start, he exhibited a strong entrepreneurial spirit, particularly in organizing the social aspects of the fraternity, and was elected Treasurer as a sophomore and Vice President his junior year.

As an ROTC Distinguished Military Graduate, Randy joined the U.S. Army Finance Corps for two years, after which he rejoined the Mid-City National Bank of Chicago, where he had worked summers during his undergraduate years. In 1972, he received an MBA from DePaul University, and thereafter moved up through a number of executive positions in Investments and Commercial Lending to become President in 1988. Retiring from the bank in 1998, Randy relocated to Tucson, where he and his family had previously spent much vacation time. For the next several years he continued to stay in touch with the banking and small business sectors, working on a part time basis for Peat Marwick, an international financial consulting firm. In 2002, recognizing the need for a “home town” middle market commercial bank in Tucson, Randy assembled a group of investors and founded The Commerce Bank of Arizona, of which he became President and CEO. The bank has since grown rapidly to become a major financial player in the Tucson market place. Married in 1967, he has two children and three grandchildren.

## The Delta Upsilon Fraternity

Delta Upsilon has been an integral part of campus life at Indiana University, Bloomington for more than a century. The chapter’s founders organized in 1902, and known as the Wranglers (after a debating society famous at Oxford and Cambridge Universities) included such campus leaders as John Whittenberger, creator of the Indiana Memorial Union. This group subsequently became the Indiana Chapter of Delta Upsilon in 1915, and the tradition of leadership in campus activities, athletics and scholarship has continued to this day.



Located at 1200 East Third Street in Bloomington, Delta Upsilon is a unique fraternal organization in that it is non-secret and all of its ceremonies and rituals are open to the public. Its main purposes are the promotion of friendship, the development of character, the diffusion of liberal culture, and the advancement of justice.

# The Yenerich Brothers Delta Upsilon Scholarship

## Purpose:

The Yenerich Brothers Scholarship is intended to promote the continued academic success of the members of the Indiana Chapter of Delta Upsilon Fraternity and assist the chapter in recruiting and retaining outstanding members. Specifically, it will annually recognize and honor an active member of the chapter who has proven himself as a leader within Delta Upsilon and in extracurricular activities on campus, while at the same time achieving academic excellence. This scholarship award may be used in any manner to offset the costs of obtaining an education at Indiana University, Bloomington (IUB).

## Qualifications:

The Scholarship each year will be given to a student at IUB who is an active member of Delta Upsilon Fraternity and who meets the following criteria:

- Must be in good standing with Delta Upsilon with no outstanding house bills, fines, or fees;
- Must have a declared major at IUB, with first preference given to those in the liberal arts or the School of Business;
- Must have a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale);
- Must have demonstrated exceptional leadership within Delta Upsilon;
- Must have a strong record of participation in extracurricular activities.

## Selection:

At the beginning of the fall semester, application forms for this scholarship will be made available by the Delta Upsilon VP-Scholarship. Completed

forms, signed and dated by the applicant, must be returned to him not later than October 15 for consideration. The scholarship selection committee will then review all applications and name the award recipient near the end of the fall semester. The award will be presented to the recipient usually in conjunction with a fraternal event such as the fall pledge class initiation ceremony.

## Amount:

The recipient of the Yenerich Brothers Scholarship will receive a one-time award of \$2,000 to be used to offset the cost of obtaining an education at IUB.

## The Yenerich Brothers

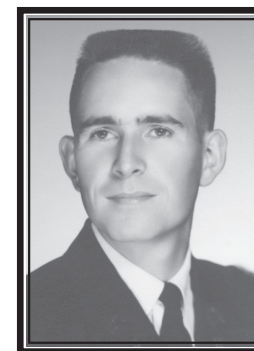

After retiring from GE in 1989, he took a position as President of Wright Line, Inc., an office equipment company in Massachusetts for two years and then returned to Milwaukee to become Executive Vice President responsible for operations of Applied Power, Inc., a \$400 million NYSE company from which he retired in 1994. Married in 1957, he has four children and eight grandchildren all of whom live in the Milwaukee area.



**Ron** majored in Political Science with minors in History and Business. He was active in student government, and was elected Vice President of the Student Body/President of the Student Senate, and President of the I.U. Junior Class. Ron was also active within the D.U. house, serving in a number of

positions including Treasurer. He was elected Chairman of the Judicial Board of the Inter-Fraternity Council his senior year and based on his campus leadership and scholarship, was named to the I.U. Board of Aeons by the University. As an ROTC Distinguished Military Graduate, he joined the U.S. Army after college, rising to the rank of Captain in a variety of domestic and international assignments. After leaving service, Ron took a position at the corporate headquarters of the Quaker Oats Company in Chicago, later becoming Director of Human Resources for the International Division. After 11 years with Quaker, Ron joined Chicago's leading commercial bank for small to medium size businesses – American National Bank & Trust – where he served as Vice President of Human Resources. Retiring from the bank in 1999, Ron has remained active working in advisory and fund raising capacities with not-for-profit groups in the Chicago area.
